Silvia Şoşoiu

Silvia Șoșoiu is a visual artist that combines numerous techniques in intricate forms and shapes. She juxtaposes and rearranges fragments so as to render personal and unexpected visual meanings. The prevailing surface is paper, but she also expresses the insight of her inner world on canvas, using graphic techniques. A surprising element would be represented by miniature mosaics made out of organic and mineral elements from the environment (seashells, snails and pebbles) whose natural hues and materiality employed in precise compositions envisions a unique universe. The dominant themes are vegetal structures that create delicate images in a decorative manner whose fluidity achieved through colour and curved shapes render a poetic atmosphere.

Nina Kluth

In her paintings, Nina Kluth explores an ancient terrain of painting history, the treatment of space on a two-dimensional surface. This is not a matter of epistemology, but rather of satisfying a need for abstraction, while at the same time shaping the image so vividly that it holds lasting interest. The genre of landscape lends itself to this. In it, the frame of the picture is blown up in an exemplary way, without this seeming particularly absurd to us. The whole problem of painting fans out: One moves through a landscape between depth and surface, between desire for true perspective and disturbance of the illusionary means, alternating between movement and rigidity.

With gestures and different surface treatment, various layers and painting, a different kind of history painting emerges, a stretch of production time is deposited in the picture and tells, wonderfully formal, almost symbolic of distribution, of back and forth, of balancing, of fluid throwing of material. One can take a walk in the best way.
